

Changes to 2016/17 Volunteer Parks Pass

This year, to better utilise the new DEWNR Online Booking system for booking parks, we will be changing the way CFS Volunteers will be issued complimentary camping and entry to National Parks.

We will be issuing each volunteer with a unique code number. This unique code number is then used to make an online booking of a campsite/facility etc.

Booking a camp site online

1. Visit www.parks.sa.gov.au and navigate to the park you wish to visit. Alternatively you can search for the park using the search field.


